

## Case Study #33 – Stillwater ISD

### *School district unifies all buildings under one key system*

#### **Summary**

Stillwater Independent School District was operating its schools through fragmented key systems. The district had two of its largest schools operating under Schlage F keyways, and wanted to bring all the other schools under a uniform Schlage keyway as well.

#### **Business Need**

Stillwater ISD, like many school districts, needed key control and uniformity of key systems in all of its facilities throughout the district. They had been using different key systems for different buildings, and were finding it increasingly difficult as time passed to manage these systems and keep track of the keys. In addition to needing a uniform key system, the district was considering changing their existing knob locks to lever classroom security locks.

#### **Challenges**

The primary challenge Stillwater ISD faced was finding a key system that supported their need for a unified district that had total key control.

#### **Solution**

After meeting with the district and understanding their specific needs for a new key system, the IR Key System Consultant, Dan Sauer, and End User Sales Representative, Rick Dewhirst, were able to create a key system schematic. This plan incorporated all of the facilities within the district. With the concern of not being able to duplicate keys easily, the Schlage Classic Primus product was a perfect and obvious fit.

#### **Results**

Since the implementation of the new Classic Primus key system, Stillwater School District has relied on the recommendations of the local IR Key System Consultants for all projects.
