

Case Study #39 – Orange Coast College

College campus regains key control with Everest D

Summary

Orange Coast College in Costa Mesa, California had lost control of their key system. In order to regain full key control, Everest D End User Restricted prevented the unauthorized duplication of keys.

Business Need

Orange Coast College had lost control of their keys and key systems, and needed to change to a key system where the administration would have strict key control. Like most college campuses, security of the students, teachers, and property comes first. And in this case, Everest D End User Restricted key system was the answer.

Challenges

Because Orange Coast College had so many buildings on their campus, key maintenance and tracking were issues of concern. However, Sitemaster 200 proved to be an ideal solution because it allowed the college maintenance department and locksmith to maintain the key systems, as well as track the keys.

Solution
